~MARY'S HOUR~

On Sunday, May 15, 1983, Bishop Mark Hurley called for the Re-Dedication of the Diocese to the Blessed Virgin Mary in the course of "Mary's Hour". The ceremony was held at Saint Sebastian's Parish in Sebastopol where Monsignor William Serado acted as the Delegate of the Bishop. At the beginning of this year, Bishop Vasa asked that we take special note of the 100th Anniversary of the Apparitions of Mary at Fatima and that we work and plan for a renewal of this Dedication of the Diocese to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The dates for this Renewal of Consecration span December 8 through 12 but especially at all Masses on Saturday, December 9 and Sunday, December 10, 2017. At the Cathedral and in those parishes where it can be arranged, a special "Mary's Hour" Vigil will be held at 8:00 pm on **December 9, 2017**. During the Vigil, which will last approximately one hour, we will listen to the Word of God, recite the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary, sing a number of Marian hymns and then recite the Act of Consecration.

MY CATHOLIC FAITH

CHRIST THE KING

~FROM ETERNITY TO ETERNITY~

"Each year the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King and gloriously acknowledges the Kingship of Jesus Christ. For Jesus Christ is not just King of the saints or of Catholics. Jesus Christ is King of all Creation from eternity to eternity. For not only did He create all that exists, He also redeemed all mankind to restore creation to a greater glory. He deserves all glory, honor, and praise. As we read frequently in the Liturgy of the Hours: "O Lord our God, you are worthy to receive glory and honor and power" (Revelations 4:11) Jesus Christ is the King of the Universe, the King of all creation, of all things seen and unseen. Let that thought just sit in your mind. Just take it in and meditate on that statement - Jesus Christ is the King of the Universe. And even though His dominion is the universe, He cares for each of us with a love inconceivable. This love was displayed on the Cross and it continues to be renewed each and every moment that the bread and wine at Mass become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ."

~A HUMBLE KING~

"As Mother Teresa said, 'When you look at the crucifix, you understand how much Jesus loved you. When you look at the Sacred Host you understand how much Jesus loves you now.' In the traditional Gospel passage (1962 Missal) for the Feast of Christ the King (i.e. John 18:33-37), Jesus Christ, the King of kings, is taken before Pilate. And Pilate does not recognize Him as King. Instead he asks Jesus "Are you the King of the Jews?" And Jesus, who humbled Himself even unto death, does not call on the legions of angels ready to help Him. Instead He exclaims, 'My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being

handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here.' I have frequently thought about that verse. No matter how bad life in our current nations and kingdoms gets, I realize that one day I shall enter Jesus Christ's everlasting Kingdom - the kingdom not of this world."

~NOT AN EARTHLY KING~

"The Israelites, God's chosen people, were given a king over 3,000 years ago. And the Lord warned them that if they were given an earthly king there would be a grave list of problems. But the Israelites demanded one. They didn't just want the Lord God as King, they wanted an earthy one. So Saul was anointed with holy Chrism oil, and from that day, Israel suffered many problems. Until at last the King of kings, Jesus Christ, came into the midst of the Jewish leaders. But they didn't know Him. Their very creator was not recognized by them. And so they cried out, "We have no king but Caesar" (John 19:15). What a lie! The Jewish leaders absolutely hated Caesar and the Roman occupation. They historically despised Caesar. But, they could not carry out an execution without Rome. So they swallow their pride here and exclaimed their king was Caesar. Now it should be clear how much the Jewish leaders hated Christ - they would rather honor Caesar, who they hated. And the Jewish leaders convinced the crowd to join them, and all of them called out "Crucify Him". What pain must have radiated in the heart of Our Savior as His people rejected Him. They subjected their true king, Jesus Christ, to the worst form of execution at that time, reserved for only the most wretched criminals - crucifixion. And as the King of Glory mounted His Cross with a crown of thorns, He redeemed the world. And as He hung on that tree, two criminals were crucified with Him - one on his right and one on his left. And one of them mocked Jesus. But the other one, obviously a man put to death for grave

His sins, begged for mercy. . He looked at Jesus and said, "Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). That thief repented and acknowledged Christ's kingship (this repentant thief is called St. Dismas in the Church's traditions). And the Lord replies to Him: "Today you will be with Me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43). Remember the thief had a "death bed" conversion. He couldn't do any "works" throughout his life for Jesus Christ. Instead he could only confess Jesus Christ as King. And that confession was a work in and of itself. Remember the words of St. James: "For just as a Body without a spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead" (James 2:26)."

~A HUMBLE KING~

"Let us clean our souls in Confession and receive the Eucharist in joy. May Christ the King reign in all of us. For His dominion is not just of the earth, sky, and cosmos. His dominion is also in our souls."

~A PRAYER TO CHRIST THE KING~

"O Jesus Christ, I acknowledge Thee as universal King. All that has been made, has been created for Thee. Exercise all Thy rights over me. I renew my baptismal vows, renouncing Satan, his pomps and his works; and I promise to live as a good Christian. In particular do I pledge myself to labor, to the best of my ability, for the triumph of the rights of God and Thy Church. Divine Heart of Jesus, to Thee do I proffer my poor services, laboring that all hearts may acknowledge Thy Sacred Kingship, and that thus the reign of Thy peace be established throughout the whole universe." WORKS OF MERCY

~HELPING OUR NEIGHBOR~

In our Gospel reading today, Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me." With this in mind, let us re-examine the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy which are actions we can perform that extend God's compassion and mercy to those in need. The Corporal Works of Mercy are acts by which we help our neighbors with their material and physical needs: feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, visit the sick and imprisoned, bury the dead and give alms to the poor. The Spiritual Works of Mercy are acts of

compassion, by which we help our neighbors with their emotional and spiritual needs. Instruct, advise, console, comfort, forgive and bear wrongs patiently.

~FINDING JESUS IN EVERY SITUATION~

Donna-Marie Cooper O'Boyle, EWTN Television host and Catholic author, notes "I can't merely look for Jesus in a crippled, homeless woman. I need to discover Him within the ones I love who might not be acting very loving. I firmly believe that we grow in holiness when we choose to serve Jesus in our spouses and family members when they are acting out or are in rare form. During those difficult moments when we respond in love, many graces are to be found and our hearts and their hearts are transformed."

~LOVING THE UNLOVABLE~

In her autobiography, "The Story of a Soul," St. Thérèse of Lisieux writes about one particular nun who got under her skin, saying the woman irritated her no matter what she said or did. "As I did not want to give way to my natural dislike for her, I told myself that charity should not only be a matter of feeling but should show itself in deeds. So I set myself to do for this sister just what I should have done for someone I loved most dearly," St. Thérèse wrote. Every time she met this nun, she prayed for her. She did things for her day after day, and when she thought she might say something unpleasant about her, she smiled instead. "And after all this she asked me one day with a beaming face, 'Sister Thérèse, will you please tell me what attracts you so much to me? You give me such a charming smile whenever we meet,'" St. Thérèse recalled. "Ah! It was Jesus hidden in the depths of her soul who attracted me, Jesus who makes the bitterest things sweet!" DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PADRE ROA

Trigésimo Cuarto Domingo Tiempo Ordinario

Leamos con atención parte del Opúsculo de Orígenes, Presbítero, sobre la oración.

Si, como dice nuestro Señor y Salvador, el reino de Dios no ha de venir espectacularmente, ni dirán: «Vedlo aquí o vedlo allí», sino que el reino de Dios está dentro de nosotros, pues cerca está la palabra, en nuestra boca y en nuestro corazón, sin duda cuando pedimos que venga el reino de Dios lo que pedimos es que este reino de Dios, que está dentro de nosotros, salga afuera, produzca fruto y se vaya perfeccionando.

Efectivamente, Dios reina ya en cada uno de los santos, ya que éstos se someten a su ley espiritual, y así Dios habita en ellos como en una ciudad bien gobernada. En el alma perfecta está presente el Padre, y Cristo reina en ella junto con el Padre, de acuerdo con aquellas palabras del Evangelio: Vendremos a fijar en él nuestra morada.

Este reino de Dios que está dentro de nosotros llegará, con nuestra cooperación, a su plena perfección cuando se realice lo que dice el Apóstol, esto es, cuando Cristo, una vez sometidos a él todos sus enemigos, entregue el reino a Dios Padre, para que Dios sea todo en todo. Por esto, rogando incesantemente con aquella actitud interior que se hace divina por la acción del Verbo, digamos a nuestro Padre que está en los cielos: Santificado sea tu nombre, venga tu reino.

Con respecto al reino de Dios, hay que tener también esto en cuenta: del mismo modo que no tiene que ver la justificación con la impiedad, ni hay nada de común entre la luz y las tinieblas, ni puede haber armonía entre Cristo y Belial, así tampoco pueden coexistir el reino de Dios y el reino del pecado.

Por consiguiente, si queremos que Dios reine en nosotros, procuremos que de ningún modo continúe el pecado reinando en nuestro cuerpo mortal, antes bien, mortifiquemos las pasiones de nuestro hombre terrenal y fructifiquemos por el Espíritu; de este modo Dios se pasará por nuestro interior como por un paraíso espiritual y reinará en nosotros él solo con su Cristo, el cual se sentará en nosotros a la derecha de aquella virtud espiritual que deseamos alcanzar: se sentará hasta que todos sus enemigos que hay en nosotros sean puestos por estrado de sus pies, y sean reducidos a la nada en nosotros todos los principados, todos los poderes y todas las fuerzas.

Todo esto puede realizarse en cada uno de nosotros, y el último enemigo, la muerte, puede ser reducido a la nada, de modo que Cristo diga también en nosotros: ¿Dónde está, muerte, tu victoria? ¿Dónde está, muerte, tu aguijón? Ya desde ahora este nuestro ser, corruptible, debe revestirse de santidad y de incorruptión, y este nuestro ser, mortal, debe revestirse de la inmortalidad del Padre, después de haber reducido a la nada el poder de la muerte, para que así, reinando Dios en nosotros, comencemos ya a disfrutar de los bienes de la regeneración y de la resurrección.
