### MY CATHOLIC FAITH

#### THE PRIESTHOOD

#### ~FROM THE PASTOR~

This weekend, we are asked to give generously to our Annual Ministry Appeal. This appeal covers a wide range of ministries from Catholic Schools, to Marriage and Family, to Clergy Formation and Vocations to the Religious Life. All of these ministries are so very important, as they truly are the lifeblood of our Church. As Director of Seminarians, however, I would like to focus today, on the area of Religious Vocations. As many of you know, vocations to the priesthood fell dramatically and drastically beginning in around 1975. The number of priests exploded in 1950 and peaked in 1970. After this, there was a slow but steady decrease in the number of priests and then, the decline became quite steep around 1990. Sadly, the priests ordained from 1970 -1980, will be reaching retirement age between the years 2015-2025 (age 25 + 45 years of service = retirement age 70). What does this mean to the average lay person? Well, in 1950, there was 1 priest to every 652 Catholics in the United States. As of 2016, there was 1 priest to every 1,843 Catholics in the United States. It will only get worse, before it gets better. However, rather than depress you with these statistics, I want to share with you today words of wisdom and encouragement from some of our great priests and nuns from the past - many of whom are saints and also lived in trying times. Aided by our fervent prayers, let us hope that among our seminarians and sisters today, we will have many saints rise up and renew the Church!

### ~FULTON J. SHEEN~

"Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen could not recall a time in his life when he did not want to be a priest. At his First Communion, he prayed that one day he would be ordained to the priesthood. That day came in September 1919, when the 24-year-old son of Newton and Delia Sheen was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Peoria, Illinois. Sheen would become a towering figure in the Catholic Church in the 20th century, known to millions as a brilliant orator and a master teacher of the faith on television and radio, in many dozens of books, and from the pulpit. But for more than 60 years, Sheen was first, foremost, and always a priest. He wrote and spoke

often about the priesthood. He gave many retreats later in life to remind his brother priests who and what they truly are. Even more than 40 years after his death, Sheen's teachings stand as a faithful sentinel against modern efforts to "reform" the priesthood by dispatching with celibacy or even ordaining women. It is easy to imagine him today before a podium and microphone, explaining in stirring tones and rich voice why Our Blessed Lord made the holy priesthood as He did. It's easy because he gave those talks and wrote passionate words about his vocation and his life."

#### ~ALTER CHRISTUS~

"Sheen emphasized that priests were ambassadors of Jesus Christ and alter Christus, "other Christs," who are "dispensers of the mysteries of God." The role and essential characteristics of the priesthood come from Christ himself, Sheen said; to attempt to change or modify them would be to oppose God's divine plan. Christ calls the priest, makes the priest, and provides the grace for him to completely offer himself as priest and victim. This is the way he continues the priesthood of Our Blessed Lord," Sheen said in his talk, "Holy Orders." "Our Lord was not a priest because he was eternally begotten by the Father. Our Lord was a priest because he had a human nature, which he could offer up for our salvation. And so we too, continuing that priesthood, are something like Jacob's Ladder – it reaches up to the heavens and yet at the same time it is placed on the earth. Therefore every priest is a kind of another Christ, having vertical relations to Christ and Heaven and horizontal relations to men on earth."

### ~TOTAL GIFT OF SELF~

"In his many retreats for priests and bishops, Sheen often said that priestly celibacy is misunderstood as an undue burden; a cruel cross that is unfairly forced upon priests. Rather, Sheen argued, celibacy is a gift from Christ to his priests. Celibacy, Sheen said during one retreat, is a treasure the Blessed Lord keeps in "pots of earthenware." The earthenware pots "have received a gift. A gift: celibacy. That is the way Our Lord describes it, as a gift. That is the way the Vatican Council describes it. Celibacy is a gift that is given to some men. He gave it to us. We did not offer celibacy, we received it. And as

long as we remain close to Him, we will have it and keep it."

### ~BEARABLE AND JOYFUL~

"Sheen said the key is for priests to be so closely conformed to Christ as to take on his nature and imitate him. "Celibacy is hardest when we fall out of love with Christ," Sheen wrote. "Then it becomes a great burden. Once we priests put celibacy in the context of the Church and discuss its history, its sociology and the like, there is a groaning under the burden. Once we see it in relation to Christ, then it is less a problem and more a matter of love. Celibacy as an ecclesiastical law is hard. Celibacy as a question of discipleship is hard too, but bearable and joyful" (Treasure in Clay: the Autobiography of Fulton J. Sheen, [New York: Image Books/Doubleday, 1980], page 214).

#### ~MAKE A HOLY HOUR~

"Sheen always implored priests to make a daily Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament, a practice he carried out every day of his priesthood (nearly 22,000 Holy Hours). Any priest who does this, he said, would not be lost. "I could draw a curve of my own life...my attitude toward celibacy would be seen always in direct relationship to my personal love of Christ," he wrote in *Treasure in Clay*. "Once our passions cease to burn for him, they begin to burn toward creatures. Celibacy is not the absence of passion; it is rather the intensity of a passion." https://www.catholicworldreport.com/2020/02/20/celibacy-is-not-the-absence-of-passion-fulton-sheen-on-celibacy-and-the-priesthood/

### ~ST. TERESA OF AVILA~

"Let nothing perturb you, nothing frighten you. All things pass. God does not change. Patience achieves everything."

"May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received, and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones, and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise and love. It is there for each and every one of us."

#### ~ST. THERESE OF LISIEUX~

"Miss no single opportunity of making some small sacrifice, here by a smiling look, there by a kindly word; always doing the smallest right and doing it all for love."

"Holiness consists simply in doing God's will, and being just what God wants us to be."

"Our Lord does not so much look at the greatness of our actions, or even at their difficulty, as at the love with which we do them."

#### ~ST. EDITH STEIN~

"And when night comes, and you look back over the day and see how fragmentary everything has been, and how much you planned that has gone undone, and all the reasons you have to be embarrassed and ashamed: just take everything exactly as it is, put it in God's hands and leave it with Him."

## Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma

Leamos con atención este sermón de San León Magno, Papa, sobre la ley que se nos dio por mediación de Moisés y la gracia que nos ha venido por Jesucristo. El Señor descubre su gloria en presencia de unos testigos escogidos e ilumina con tan gran esplendor aquella forma corporal, que le es común con todos, que su rostro se pone brillante como el sol y sus vestidos blancos como la nieve. Sin duda esta transfiguración tenía sobre todo la finalidad de quitar del corazón de los discípulos el escándalo de la cruz, a fin de que la humillación de la pasión voluntariamente aceptada no perturbara la fe de aquellos a quienes había sido revelada la excelencia de la dignidad oculta. Mas, con igual providencia, daba al mismo tiempo un fundamento a la esperanza de la Iglesia, ya que todo el cuerpo de Cristo pudo conocer la transformación con que él también sería enriquecido, y todos sus miembros cobraron la esperanza de participar en el honor que había resplandecido en la cabeza.

A este respecto, el mismo Señor había dicho, refiriéndose a la majestad de su advenimiento: Los santos brillarán entonces como el sol en el reino de su Padre. Y el apóstol san Pablo afirma lo mismo, cuando dice: Considero que los trabajos de ahora no pesan lo que la gloria que un día se nos descubrirá; y también: Porque habéis muerto y vuestra vida está oculta con Cristo en Dios; cuando se manifieste Cristo, que es vuestra vida, os manifestaréis también vosotros con él revestidos de gloria.

Además, los apóstoles, que tenían que ser fortalecidos en su fe e iniciados en el conocimiento de todas las cosas, hallaron también en este milagro una nueva enseñanza. En efecto, Moisés y Elías, es decir, la ley y los profetas, se aparecieron, hablando con el Señor; y ello para que se cumpliera con toda perfección, por la presencia de estos cinco hombres, lo que está escrito: Sólo por la declaración de dos o tres testigos se podrá fallar una causa. ¿Qué más estable, qué más firme que esta causa? Para proclamarla, la doble trompeta del antiguo y del nuevo Testamento resuena concorde, y todo lo que en tiempos pasados sirvió para testimoniarla coincide con la enseñanza evangélica.

Las páginas de una y otra alianza, en efecto, se confirman mutuamente, y el resplandor de la gloria presente muestra, de una manera manifiesta y cierta, lo que las antiguas figuras habían prometido bajo el velo del misterio; es que, como dice san Juan, la ley se nos dio por mediación de Moisés, pero la gracia y la verdad nos han venido por Jesucristo, ya que en él han llegado a su cumplimiento la promesa de las figuras mesiánicas y el significado de los preceptos de la ley; pues, con su presencia, enseña la verdad de la profecía y, con su gracia, hace posible la práctica de los mandamientos.

Que la proclamación del santo Evangelio sirva, pues, para fortalecer la fe de todos, y que nadie se avergüence de la cruz de Cristo, por la que el mundo ha sido redimido. Nadie, por tanto, tema el sufrimiento por causa de la justicia, nadie dude que recibirá la recompensa prometida, ya que a través del esfuerzo es como se llega al reposo y a través de la muerte a la vida; el Señor ha asumido toda la debilidad propia de nuestra pobre condición, y, si nosotros perseveramos en su confesión y en su amor, vencemos lo que él ha vencido y recibimos lo que ha prometido.
