MY CATHOLIC FAITH

MOTHER'S DAY

~FROM THE PASTOR~

I would like to wish a happy and blessed Mother's Day to all of the mothers of this parish. Motherhood is a most difficult, and yet, most rewarding, vocation. We remember to honor our mothers in this month of May because May is the month of Mary, Mother to us all. Let us take a look at some brief biographies of saintly mothers who gave their all to God and to their families. We will begin with the Mother of God.

SAINTLY MOTHERS

~THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY~

The Blessed Mother offers us the perfect example of a virtuous mother. Her will was always perfectly aligned with God's will. She faced many hardships and difficulties. She had to travel to a strange land (Egypt), far away from family and friends, when she was a very young mother. She also had to endure watching her beloved Son suffer so greatly. Mary does understand the struggles we face as mothers, and her intercession is especially powerful since she is so close to Jesus. Pope Paul VI noted, "We believe that the Holy Mother of God, the new Eve, Mother of the Church, continues in heaven to exercise her maternal role on behalf of the members of Christ." There are many feast days devoted to Mary throughout the year, but she is especially honored as the Mother of God on January 1st.

~ST.GIANNA MOLLA~

We often think of saints as men and women who lived long ago, but St. Gianna is a modern day saint who was not only a mother but also a pediatrician, athlete and tireless volunteer in her community. Born on October 4, 1922, in Magenta, Italy, Gianna Beretta Molla made the ultimate sacrifice by giving her life so that her child could live. Diagnosed with a tumor on her uterus, she refused to have an abortion or hysterectomy and endured a painful and difficult pregnancy and childbirth. She died on April 28, 1962, shortly after giving birth to her fourth child, also named Gianna, who is still alive today and very active in the pro-life movement. Her feast day is celebrated on April 28th.

~ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON~

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, born August 28, 1774, is the first saint to be born in the United States. She was raised in the Episcopal church, married a wealthy businessman and had five children. Sadly, her husband's business went bankrupt, and he died of tuberculosis. Now a widow and single mother, Elizabeth became a Catholic and started a school in order to support her family. She continued to endure hardships, including the death of two daughters and difficulties in her mission to lead a religious order, yet she's remembered as being cheerful and hopeful. Like her husband, she contracted tuberculosis and died at age 46, on January 4, 1821. Her feast day is celebrated on January 4th.

~ST. JUDITH~

St. Judith lived in the thirteenth century. She was born in Thuringia. This was in what is now central Germany. Judith was married at fifteen to a wealthy young nobleman. Judith tried to be a good Christian wife. She was especially generous with the poor. Her husband was a good man, but he was satisfied with his wealthy lifestyle. He expected his wife to dress and live like a rich woman. He felt that their well-dressed look would win them respect. But Judith gently persuaded him to live and dress more simply. By doing this, they would have more to give to people less fortunate than themselves. Judith's husband died suddenly while on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. The young widow raised her children alone. When the children grew up, Judith listened to a longing that had been in her heart during the busy, happy days of her life. She gave away everything and lived as a hermit. She moved to Prussia where people would not know that she was from a wealthy family. There she spent her time praying and taking care of weary travelers who passed by her little hut. She prayed especially for the conversion of nonbelievers. She prayed also for the newly baptized Christians to be true to their faith. "Three things can lead us close to God," she once said. "They are painful physical suffering, being in exile in a foreign land, and being poor by choice because of love for God." St. Judith died of fever in 1260.

~ZELIE MARTIN~

Blessed Zelie Martin and her husband, Louis, will be canonized by Pope Francis in October. Zelie is best known as the mother of St. Therese, but all five of her living children entered the religious life. This gives us insight into the emphasis on living a life for God that was present in the Martin home. Virtue: Piety. Role Model for: Mothers who suffer from headaches; Mothers with cancer; Mothers who have lost a child (4 of the Martin's children died during childhood); Stay at home moms.

~ST. EMILIA~

Not much is known about the life of St. Emilia, but we do know that she must have been doing something right. Five of her ten children would be named Saints by the Catholic Church: Saints Macrina, Basil, Peter of Sebaste, Gregory of Nyssa, and Theosebia. St. Emilia is a beautiful example of creating a culture holiness the of prayer and in home. Virtue: Piety. Role Model for: Mothers of Large Families; Mothers of children in religious vocations Quote: "To you, O Lord, I give the first fruits and the tithe of the fruit of my womb. The first fruit is my first-born daughter, and the tithe is this, my youngest son. Let these be for you a rightly acceptable sacrifice, and let your holiness descend upon them!" - St. Emilia

~HANNAH-MOTHER OF SAMUEL~

Hannah waited for many years to have a child, but she never gave up faithfully praying to God. After many years of yearning for a baby of her own, we know it must have been with great difficulty that Hannah presented her child in the temple and dedicated his life to God. She is an example of what every mother must do. We must trust that when we submit to God's plan for our child that He will provide for them better than we can. Virtue: Obedience Role model for: Mothers who face anxiety about their children; Mothers who live apart from their grown children. Quote: "Oh, my lord! As your soul lives, my lord, I am the woman who stood here beside you, praying to the Lord. For this boy I prayed, and the Lord has given me my petition which I asked of Him. So I have also dedicated him to the Lord; as long as he lives he is dedicated to the Lord." https://catholic-link.org/10-saints-who-weremothers/

~DEL PÁRROCO~

Quisiera desear un feliz y bendecido Día de la Madre a todas las madres de esta parroquia. La maternidad es una vocación muy difícil y, sin embargo, muy gratificante. Recordamos honrar a nuestras madres en este mes de mayo porque mayo es el mes de María, Madre de todos nosotros. Veamos algunas biografías breves de madres santas que lo dieron todo por Dios y por sus familias. Comenzaremos por la Madre de Dios.

MADRES SANTAS

~LA SANTÍSIMA VIRGEN MARÍA~

La Santísima Virgen nos ofrece el ejemplo perfecto de una madre virtuosa. Su voluntad siempre estuvo perfectamente alineada con la voluntad de Dios. Se enfrentó a muchas penurias y dificultades. Tuvo que viajar a una tierra extraña (Egipto), lejos de su familia y amigos, cuando era una madre muy joven. También tuvo que soportar ver sufrir tanto a su amado Hijo. María comprende las luchas que afrontamos como madres, y su intercesión es especialmente poderosa por estar tan cerca de Jesús. El Papa Pablo VI señaló: "Creemos que la Santa Madre de Dios, la nueva Eva, Madre de la Iglesia, continúa en el cielo ejerciendo su función maternal en favor de los miembros de Cristo." Hay muchas fiestas dedicadas a María a lo largo del año, pero se la honra especialmente como Madre de Dios el 1 de enero.

~SANTA GIANNA MOLLA~

A menudo pensamos en los santos como hombres y mujeres que vivieron hace mucho tiempo, pero Santa Gianna es una santa moderna que no sólo fue madre, sino también pediatra, atleta y voluntaria incansable en su comunidad. Nacida el 4 de octubre de 1922 en Magenta (Italia), Gianna Beretta Molla hizo el sacrificio supremo de dar su vida para que su hijo pudiera vivir. Diagnosticada con un tumor en el útero, se negó a someterse a un aborto o a una histerectomía y soportó un embarazo y un parto dolorosos y difíciles. Murió el 28 de abril de 1962, poco después de dar a luz a su cuarta hija, también llamada Gianna, que sigue viva y muy activa en el movimiento próvida. Su fiesta se celebra el 28 de abril.
